# <u>CHAPTER HISTORY</u> *"Reflections"*

## THE BIG CEMENT BLOCKHOUSE AT RICHARDS-GEBAUR

Yes, this article is about that big old building in the middle of the former Richards-Gebaur AFB. If you were not there in the 1950's & 60's, you probably do not know its history, so here goes.



Richards-Gebaur was an Air Defense base then and was a prime component of NORAD, a combined organization of the U.S. & Canada, that provided aerospace warning, air sovereignty and protection for North America. The R-G blockhouse, built in 1956 & 57, was known as the <u>SAGE</u> building (Semi-Automatic Ground Environment), a computerized control system for tracking and intercepting enemy aircraft. The blockhouse contained a system of large computers & associated networking equipment that coordinated data from many radar sites and processed it to produce an image of the airspace over a wide area. The R-G SAGE building was one of about 22 around the country, designed to spot soviet long-range nuclear bombers before they could drop their bombs of destruction on American soil, by directing in flight U.S. and Canadian Interceptor Aircraft to the intercept.

SAGE operations at Richards-Gebaur ended on December 31, 1969, but it continued at many Air Defense Bases up into the 1980's. Just how it was during the Cold War times.
