My fellow AFSA Chapter 804 members,

I have written many articles over the years for our quarterly Newsletters, but none have hurt my heart more than this one. Our beloved Chapter has reached a tipping point in its long and illustrious history, one that if we can't find a way to recover from, will be the end of our Chapter as we have known it.

For decades, the same 15 to 20 members have kept our Chapter afloat. Unfortunately, we have lost many of those members to death, age and relocation to other states. The simple fact is we have almost reached the point of no return as a Chapter and, if we can't get current members to volunteer to participate in leading our Chapter, we simply will cease to exist as a functioning Chapter. Thanks to COVID-19 and diminished participation before the pandemic, we

have no revenue stream to speak of and we are running out of money. In fact, we didn't have the money to mail this letter to each of you, but we felt it was important to give you the truth about where we are as a Chapter, which is why you're receiving this letter via email.

We are going to hold a meeting in January 2021 or sooner. If we don't get new members attending who are willing to hold office, take on the position of Newsletter Editor, help with organizing Chapter events and fundraising, this will be the last Newsletter you receive from Chapter 804. We don't like this anymore than you do, but this is the reality of where we are today.

I would hate to see our Chapter become a Chapter on paper only so if you can volunteer to help, please plan to attend the January 12th meeting, 7:00 PM, at the Belton Senior Center, 609 Minnie Avenue and bring new energy to our Chapter. There is nothing to be afraid of; we will not throw any volunteer to the wolves. We will train them to fulfil the role they volunteer to fill and we will thank them for it. This is our Chapter and if we are going to save it, we will have to do it together.
